He was a great military leader, known for his great conquests. In addition to that, he is known for being stabbed to death by a group of his trusted senators.

Augustus Caesar was Julius' great-nephew, who was later adopted by him and became his heir and son. Augustus Caesar was the first emperor of the new Roman Empire, taking over after his father's death. Julius never got to lead the empire he built. Aaron's Answers continued some, because he was the first emperor (and a very successful one too!).

The Pax Romana is credited to Augustus. After being crowned "Augustus" by the senate in 27 BCE, the Pax Romana began and lasted 207 years. This is largely because Augustus and his successors were great leaders who didn't make very many bad decisions, and because Augustus strengthened the Roman economy and military to make it so stable that almost nobody could even touch it. The Pax Romana literally means "Roman Peace" in Latin.

So, Julius was credited with creating the Roman Empire, but Augustus was credited with actually leading it, and doing a very good job at it.
