We were glad that the invitation included an explanation of what that was, because we'd never heard the term before. We were told that it was a 'sitting rehearsal' (the term comes from German), and we couldn't help but be intrigued with the additional explication, a bit of which I'll quote here:


"During a sitzprobe (or "sitz"), the production cast and orchestra musicians run through the performance together as a single unit for the first time."

We found that there had been only a small number of invitees, so we luxuriated for the next 90 minutes or so in our favorite seats (center section, row C) and listened to the excellent voices of the children and adult actors running through songs like "The Lonely Goatherd," "Do Re Mi," and "Climb Every Mountain" – while the six members of the live orchestra created a full sound in accompaniment. The "teams" were remarkably in-synch, given this was their first time working together. We had a wonderful time watching!

for his philosophical reflections and writings, particularly the work titled "Meditations." *Meditations* is a series of personal writings by Marcus Aurelius, and it is essentially a collection of his thoughts, reflections, and philosophical musings. He wrote these meditations as a form of self-examination and guidance, intended for his own use rather than publication.

Meditations is a prominent example of Stoic philosophy. Stoicism is a school of philosophy that originated in ancient Greece and later flourished in Rome, teaches that the path to virtue is through cultivating a rational and virtuous mindset, regardless of external circumstances. Stoics advocate for self-control, acceptance of what cannot be changed, and a focus on one's own actions and character.

The most remarkable thing about Marcus Aurelius writing *Meditations* is the position he was in when he wrote it. He was able to maintain a calm demeanor throughout his rule, and his writing was written similarly to how he was in real life. It's truly amazing how well he composed himself and how *stoic* he acted even under the immense pressures of being the Roman Emperor of the time.

His work has been described by many as a timeless classic, an essential pillar of stoicism and a great "practical handbook for life." I would definitely recommend reading it!


